New Trees For Chartley







You may have noticed that our community has lost some trees over the years along our roadways, owing mostly to natural aging. As a result, our Chartley Neighborhood Association (CNA) has been working to find ways to replace some of those trees.

Trees, as we've come to learn, are extremely beneficial to our environment. They provide food and homes for pollinators and animals. They shade our streets and houses, lowering local temperatures. They also cleanse the air we breathe and the ground water that flows into our streams. So, we are pleased to share that CNA was just awarded a grant from the Chesapeake Bay Trust to plant 15 new trees in our community. This Urban Mini Trees grant will be used to purchase, plant, and maintain these new trees, which will be placed along one of the primary transit routes into and out of our

community, Sacred Heart Lane. The trees will be arranged along Sacred Heart Lane to beautify and shade the walkways and road. They will be planted on County property between the sidewalk and curb.

The specific tree varieties to be planted are being chosen for appropriate fit in our selected spaces by a professional landscaper, who is also a resident of our community. The tree varieties we've selected will both aid the natural environment in the north and south areas around our Chartley stream, and ensure that there is no interference with existing infrastructure (e.g., sidewalks). We will be identifying specific locations and speaking with neighbors whose property is adjacent to preferred planting areas prior to planting these trees. The trees will be planted late summer / early fall of 2023.

There is often food available for prices that are not that unreachable considering you got into the concert for free, no charge for parking and you only drove a one mile from Chartley.

Bloomin' Artfest in May is also a good bet for the frugal at heart swinger. Pick up something for his or her mother. Mother's Day is always next week. No admission and it's like a shopping spree for one-of-a-kind gifts and bric-a-brac. There is also food available or take that new friend to one of the many atmospheric local restaurants. The Reisterstown Festival is also a great September date location.

Donuts and coffee is always a good finish to any date. I prefer the open all-night venues of Dunkin' Donuts or Wawa.

"Dishes Of Delicious"

Hello Fellow Reisterstowners! I want to thank Crystal for offering me the opportunity to post restaurant reviews in the e-chatter, I very much appreciate it. I hope everyone finds these reviews helpful, at least to some degree!

For my "maiden review", I can think of no better place to start than "Terri's Cafe", 11409 Cronhill Dr. off Owings Mills Blvd (turn at the 7-11!) You can search and search to your heart's content, you simply will not find a kinder, more customer service-oriented duo than Terri, and her husband Menelaos. The crew in the kitchen are a pretty wonderful bunch too, including their son, William. They are bound and determined to make sure that their customers are satisfied, MORE THAN satisfied, with the food and service they so eagerly provide.

They have a very ample Breakfast and lunch menu (on the wall as you approach the counter) consisting of Breakfast sandwiches, Pancake platters, French Toast platters, 3 egg omelette platters, Hearty Breakfast bowls, and a plethora of great lunch items as well, including a variety of half subs, sandwiches and wraps of chicken, chicken salad, turkey etc., burgers, salads, burritos, and side choices including French fries, homemade chips, side salads and rice. Some of the platters, including the breakfast bowl, include excellent little red potatoes that Terri is very proud of! The price ranges from approximately \$4.99 for the breakfast sandwich, to approximately \$11.99 for some of the lunch items (most of which include a side) I've gotten the breakfast bowls, burgers, Pancake platters, omelette platters, and the burritos, and I was "above and beyond" satisfied with everything I've ordered there, the same with my wife Tina.

To repeat, besides the great food, the kind and

friendly owners, Terri and Menelous, as well as those "behind the scenes", make all visits to Terri's Cafe a truly pleasant and enjoyable experience! They Can and Do get pretty busy at peak times, so sometimes we will need a little patience, but it will be worth the wait! Fancy? Sorry, no.

But if it's great food and great service you're after in a very cute little spot (about 8 tables inside, plus picnic benches outside), Terri's is the place to be! They are open Monday - Friday, 7:00AM - 3:00PM, Saturday 9:00AM - 2:00PM, closed on Sundays.

Stop in and see Terri, Menelaos, William and the rest of the crew soon, you'll be happy you did!
