Reisterstown Main Street

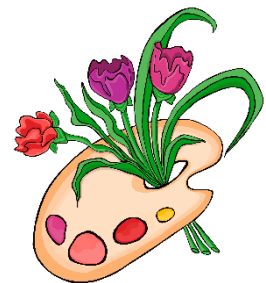
Planning is underway for Spring and Summer Events on Main Street ... come with family and friends to enjoy. Help is always welcome!

Hello Chartley Folks! As someone reading this article may know, the DOD spotlight this month shines on one of my favorite places this side of Timbuktu!

“Roadhouse” has quite the distinction of combining



WOW food, WOW service, and WOW festivity! The first thing I should mention is they unfortunately do not take reservations. They DO however take “Call Ahead”, so when your entire party arrives, you will be seated as soon as a table is available, which usually isn’t long.

Without exception from my experience, the weekends are always busy (if you’re after quiet, low-key dining, either come at lunchtime on the weekend, or drive the other way!) That however is a testament to just how much Roadhouse is loved by so many who are looking for great food in a festive atmosphere! A group of seven of us were there on a recent Sunday evening, and as very usual, we were all ultra-pleased with our meals. Our server was “Mary”, a very sweet, kind, attentive and all-smiles young lady who made our experience EVEN MORE enjoyable! Three in our group ordered the burger with fries (slightly unusual for this group), and they were all very wowed! The burger prices vary from \$8.99 to \$9.99 and come with one side. I ordered the Herb Crusted Chicken, priced at \$10.99 which as with all their entrees, comes with two sides. My two were a baked potato, and what is quite literally my favorite chili anywhere and everywhere! Everything was perfect. The table always gets fresh, luscious rolls, and a Roadhouse tradition – bags of peanuts! Also available are Starters, Salmon, Catfish, Pork Chops, Ribs, Shrimp, as well as salads and sides;

you can see the complete list of lunch and dinner items and prices on their website. Oh, and speaking of Starters, we also ordered a Cactus Blossom for the table, which was also delicious! Not ultra quiet, make no mistake about it (at least at dinnertime), but there is no issue hearing those at your table. Crime in Chartley



SPRING IS JUST A FEW DAYS AWAY! At least according to the calendar. Let's just hope that it will arrive on time this year. I am so sick of winter! I wonder if the bad guys were also fed up with winter and stayed away from Chartley during February because there were **no crimes**

reported last month – way to go Chartley! That means that our year-to-date total remains at 7 as compared to 2 at this same time last year.

As the weather starts to warm up (hopefully), there is another nemesis that always seems to plague our community...door-to-door salespeople...in many cases scam artists! So, remember what these people are required to do. Because of the number of concerns relayed to us last year, the salient points from the County Code itself are shown below. May we suggest that you print and keep it on your refrigerator or somewhere convenient for your reference,

Baltimore County Code

TITLE 11. - HUCKSTERS AND PEDDLERS

-11-101. - LICENSE REQUIRED, EXCEPTION.

- a) *In general.* Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person shall be licensed by the Clerk of the Court before the person may hawk, sell, peddle, vend, or offer for sale at retail, or for rent, any fruits, vegetables, fish, meat, poultry, oysters, goods, wares, or merchandise or service of any kind:
 - 1) In or on the streets or highways of the county; or
 - 2) By going from house to house, either in a vehicle or on foot, on the streets or highways of the county.
- b) *Exception.* This title does not apply to:
 - 1) Farmers or growers selling their own vegetables or other perishable farm products or school-age children who are engaged in fund-raising activities.

§ 21-11-103. - CONTENTS AND DISPLAY OF LICENSE.

- a) *Contents.* The information required under § 21-11-102(1) of this title shall be noted on a license issued under this title.
- b) *Labels or tags*
 - 1) The Clerk of the Court shall issue to each licensee a gum label or metal tag for each vehicle bearing:
 - a) The inscription "Baltimore County Huckster's License No. _____", which number shall be the same number as the number in the license issued to the applicant for each vehicle; and
 - b) The expiration date of the license.
 - 2) The licensee shall attach the label or tag to the vehicle to be used on the right-

hand side of the vehicle and the label or tag shall always be visible.

c) *Display*. When engaged in selling or offering goods for sale, the licensee shall:

- 1) Carry the license either in the vehicle or on the licensee's person; and
- 2) Exhibit the license whenever requested to do so by any police officer or by any person to whom the licensee is selling or offering to sell the goods described in this title.

21-11-106. - PROHIBITED ACTS.

A person subject to this title may not offer any service or item of merchandise for sale to the occupant of a residential property in the county if the owner or occupant has visibly displayed on the property a "no soliciting" sign, or a sign containing similar words.

A person subject to this title may not offer any service or item of merchandise for sale to the occupant of a residential property in the county before 9:00 a.m. or after 7 p.m. or sunset on any day, whichever is earlier. "Sunset" means the time of day identified by the National Weather Service as the time for sunset on that day in the Baltimore metropolitan area.

21-11-107. - PENALTY.

A person who violates the provisions of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$100 for each offense.

Please be very careful if you decide to conduct business with any door-to-door sales person and, at a minimum, check with the Maryland Better Business Bureau to see if the sales person or the company they claim to represent is licensed, what their BBB rating is, and whether or not there are any outstanding claims registered against that person or company, BEFORE signing any contract or paying such a person any money. Yep, spring is almost here! That means that we can finally start going outside without freezing! But it will also be time to clean up our yards and the outside of our homes. Let's also remember that with the arrival of Spring, we need to take the necessary precautions to protect our families and our property. So, take a moment and once again review all the Crime Prevention Tips below and then use them. They work!

- **Lock it up, each time, every time.**
- **Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.**
- **Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.**
- **Never leave your vehicle running unattended.**
- **Never leave valuables in your vehicles.**
- **Never leave the keys to any property inside your vehicle.**
- **Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.**
- **NEVER, EVER, FOR ANY REASON, GIVE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION WHATSOEVER TO ANYONE UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THE SOURCE FIRST**
- **If in doubt, let the police check it out!**
- **If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.**
- **Remember that if you don't call 911, there will not be a police response... no response...no police follow up to prevent further crimes...MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME. And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. MAKE THAT CALL!**

2026 CNA Scholarships

Each year, the Chartley Neighborhood Association offers two scholarships to graduating high school seniors from the Chartley community. The Joseph S. Molinaro and the Phyllis Daly Memorial Scholarships each provide a deserving graduate a cash award of \$1,000.



To be eligible for a Chartley Scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

2. Parents/legal guardians of the applicant must be homeowners in the Chartley community, and the applicant must reside in the Chartley community.
3. The applicant's household must be a current dues-paying member of the Chartley Neighborhood Association and dues must be current as of **April 1, 2026**.

On **SATURDAY, APRIL 4th** at 9 am, CNA will gather at the stream between Chartley Drive and Highmeadow Road for our **Annual Stream Clean Event!**

Paper, plastic, and other debris are blown by wind onto the streets and lawns of our community. The trash is then washed into the storm drains and carried into the streams that

form the headwaters of the Gwynn Falls Waterway. This results in an unsightly community, deteriorating stream banks, and toxic conditions for animal life. But **YOU CAN HELP!**



Meet Chartley residents and their friends on Saturday April 4th as we clean the Chartley Stream that flows from Shirley Manor Road, between Chartley Drive and Highmeadow Road, into the Gwynn Falls Watershed. Ask your school for their service hour credit forms.

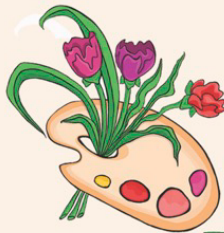
