Hello Chartley Guys and Gals! This month's DOD is all about great food, great service, cleanliness, and one sweet deal that was brought back! Applebee's features all these things we all wish for when we just don't feel much like cooking, or want a comfortable restaurant to enjoy a good meal in. A friend and I recently had lunch at Applebee's, and everything you look for when going out to eat was there in droves! First thing I need to mention is our wonderful server, “Mare”, who was just beyond friendly and attentive despite wearing a back brace, not altogether comfortable, but all smiles anyway! They brought back the all-you-can-eat deal which consists of riblets, crunchy shrimp, boneless wings and fries, all for \$15.99. One full order of one item and fries are brought out first, and then half orders of anything you want until your mouth just won't fit around one more morsel, and absolutely everything was just delicious! I had the boneless wings, and then shrimp, both with fries, and I was finished. Drinks do cost extra, but refills are at no charge. Those who are hearty eaters would find this deal very appealing, but if you're not particularly an “all-you-can-eat” person, it's OK – they've got your back! Plenty of choices of Appetizers, Burgers including Quesadillas, Grilled Cheeseburgers, and “whole lotta bacon” burgers, plus sandwiches, salads, steaks, chicken, seafood and pasta dishes such as Chicken Parm fettuccini, Four-cheese mac and cheese, Cajun salmon, along with bowls, drinks, and desserts. Plenty of tables and booths, or you can call ahead for their “to go” service and have your order brought out to you. You can see their entire

Crime in Chartley



May was certainly NOT a good month as residents reported 8 crimes during the month. This brings our year-to-date total to 21 as compared to 11 for the same period last year. Keep in mind that we only had 26 crimes reported for the entire year of 2025, so we really need to buckle down and get this under control. The 8 crimes that were reported were 3 non-domestic assaults, 2 thefts from vehicles, 1 home burglary, 1 domestic assault, and 1 case of destruction of property (vandalism). Two crimes were reported from the 400 block of Sacred Heart Lane, 2 from the 200 block of Janet Court, 1 from the 100 block of Walgrove Road, 1 from the 200 block of Walgrove Road, 1 from the 200 block of Chartley Drive, and 1 from the intersection of Sacred Heart Lane and Walgrove Road. All 8 appeared to be random with no real pattern involved. However, may I suggest that the residents of these streets take note, stay alert, and call 911 if you see or hear anything that is suspicious or out of the ordinary. That also goes for the rest of us as we really need to reduce the crime in our community.

At the May Police Community Relations Council Meeting, Captain Grantham, Commanding Officer of Precinct 3, reported that theft from

vehicles, particularly unlocked vehicles, is a major concern. Once again, he stressed that we remind everyone to always lock their vehicle when leaving it, and then to double check to make sure that it is locked. Captain Grantham also told us of a new crime that is gaining in numbers which is the theft of vehicle airbags, particularly from Hondas. The police are working to help find a solution, so stay tuned. The Captain also said that shoplifting continues to be a problem with juveniles being the main culprits.

For the past several weeks we have been getting reports of dirt bikes being ridden on our streets. Please remember that these bikes are illegal and extremely dangerous to everyone. If you see any of these bikes, please do not hesitate to immediately report it by calling 911. Try to get a description of the bikes and the riders, as well as the direction of travel. If possible, the police are most interested in getting pictures. Please help us nip this in the bud before someone gets hurt.

I continue to get reports about door-to-door salespeople in the community. For the past several months, we have published in both the regular Chartley Chatter and the Chartley eChatter the County Code relating to what these people can, and cannot, do, and what you can do to protect yourself from such people who may be simply trying to take your hard-earned money. You can access the County Code [Here](#).

And please remember to NEVER, EVER, give your personal information to ANYONE, whether you receive a text message, email, telephone call, or a document or letter that appears to be legitimate. Always treat it as a possible scam. Never click on any link or QR Code that is within the email or text message and never call any telephone number that is included in a text, email, or official looking letter. Instead, look up the email address or telephone number in your personal account documents and contact the agency or institution directly from that information instead of what is contained in the email, text message, or letter.

It's obvious that we need to tighten our belts a bit and get back to keeping our eyes and ears open to avoid becoming crime victims. Although it may seem redundant when we print our Crime Prevention Tips each month, they have proven to really work. So please review them again and put them into practice.

- Lock it up, each time, every time.
- Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.
- Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.
- Never leave your vehicle running unattended.
- Never leave valuables in your vehicles.
- Never leave the keys to any property inside your vehicle.
- Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.
- NEVER, EVER, FOR ANY REASON, GIVE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION WHATSOEVER TO ANYONE UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THE SOURCE FIRST
- If in doubt, let the police check it out!
- If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.
- Remember that if you don't call 911, there will not be a police response... no response...no police follow up to prevent further crimes...MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME. And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. MAKE THAT CALL!

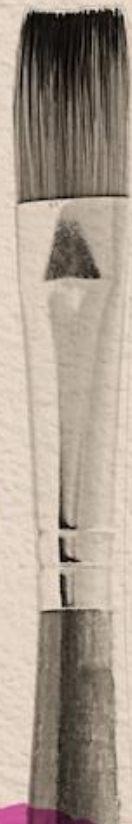

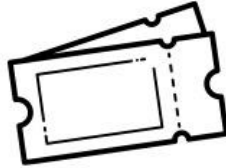

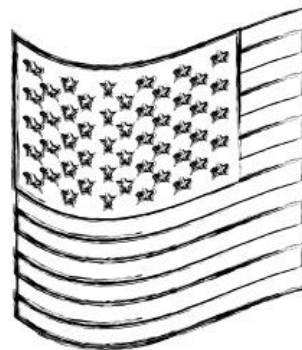
