Reisterstown Main Street

Wondering about the road work up on Main Street? A State Highway Administration (SHA) representative spoke at a recent Community Business Meeting (which meets on the 2nd Tuesday each month at Reter's, 11 am -12 pm) and said that it is a BGE utility project to replace

gas lines. After the meeting, Pat McCusker contacted them for the timeline and project expectations. The reply from SHA 10/20/25 was...

- **BGE is on track to complete the gas line installation by the end of this year.**
- **They are currently finalizing the installation of their trunk line, which is expected to be completed next week.**
- **After that, BGE will begin connecting individual service lines. Final paving will follow, weather permitting.**
- **SHA's utility inspectors are monitoring the temporary patches daily to ensure they are properly maintained."**

Each month **Volunteers** help with our Reisterstown Main Street work. If you have some time to give to either an event or our regular monthly work, please come join us?

- Volunteers meet the 1st Saturday of every month, 9 am at the Landmark Shopping Center to **walk Main Street and keep the area clear of litter.**

- If your talent lies with Economic Vitality come to the **Community Business Meetings** the 2nd Tuesday of each month at 11 am at Reter's Crab House and Grille. The meeting lasts an hour, and you are certainly welcome to stay for lunch 😊 and continue the discussion.
- **Holiday Wreath Hanging Day.** Decorating Main Street with wreaths on signs and lamp posts will happen Saturday, November 22nd,

Hello Chartley guys and gals! Sometimes, we just can't help but go out of the Reisterstown, Owings Mills and Glyndon areas to indulge in some of our favorite palate pleasing pleasures! Not that it's necessary, as we have oodles of great eateries in our own back yard! But when you're in the mood to venture a little out of our area, one spot I highly recommend to you is Good Guys N.Y. Pizza Kitchen. The employees there are very kind and courteous, which is of course a boon! The food, according to all six in our dinner group, also is as wonderful and delicious as you could possibly expect! First, they have an enormous menu selection which consists of appetizers, soups, salads, heroes, cheesesteaks, pizzas, pastas, garlic knots, wings – just about anything you could want! Tina and I shared a “Grandma Pizza” that cost \$16.99 for the 14” size (a larger 16” size is also available for \$18.99). The Grandma Pizza had Mozzarella & Romano cheeses, pizza and pesto sauce, olive oil and garlic, and was sensational! The other four in our group ordered pasta dishes, and everyone was just as pleased as they could be! You order and pay at the counter, and your food is brought to your table. It's worth repeating that the employees were very friendly and accommodating, and the food was absolute top notch! You can go online for all details about their huge menu, choices and prices. For those who don't get into Pikesville much, Hooks Lane is right off Reisterstown Rd (just north of the beltway, and just south of Trader Joe's). You turn where the Exxon station is, and then it's perhaps a 30-second drive on the right. You will not be



disappointed with either the food or service at Good Guys – and that they are! (The gals there are plenty good too!) Happy Eating!

Crime in Chartley



The ghosts, witches, and goblins were out and about on Halloween night and so were your COP Volunteers. My sincere thanks to Jimmy Roberts, Zack Roberts, and Ernie Schmidhauser for helping me to put a visible presence of our COP Program on our streets that night to ensure that our children could trick-or-treat in safety. All four of us noticed large but sporadic groups of younger kids and teenagers enjoying themselves that night, particularly on Chartley Drive, Glyndon Drive, Janet Road, and Arms Chapel Road. Everyone seemed to enjoy themselves and there were no problems noted or reported. During our patrols, and on several social media posts afterwards, several of you thanked CNA for our efforts to keep our kids safe and maintain our community as a clean, safe, and pleasant place to live. Now that really puts a smile on our faces!

Chartley residents reported 3 crimes during October which brings our year-to-date total to 26 as compared to 32 for the same period last year. We're always glad to see a reduction in crime, so let's work to keep it that way! The three crimes reported during October were 2 incidents of domestic assault and one case of vandalism (destruction of property). As usual, we do not specify the approximate locations of the domestic assaults to protect the privacy of those involved. The vandalism incident was reported in the 300 Block of Shirley Manor Road.

The police continue to report that major crimes, such as robbery, murder, rape, etc., are still trending downward as compared to last year, while other crimes (e.g., auto theft, theft from vehicles, and shoplifting) are still increasing.

As the days get colder you may be tempted to warm up your vehicle while you are inside your home before leaving in the morning. Not only can that cost you the loss of your vehicle, but it can also result in a hefty fine as leaving a motor vehicle running unattended is against the law. And take note also to **never** leave valuables (e.g., wallets, computers, house keys, Christmas presents) in your vehicle, and particularly never leave them in plain sight. You can bet that the bad guys are going to be looking for those prime targets of opportunity! Almost daily, I see reports of people on social media stating that their vehicle was entered during the previous night. And in most of those cases the vehicle was **unlocked!** Always remember to lock it up **every time** and **double-check** to make sure it's locked! And double-check that all items of value have been removed from the vehicle.

Most of us occasionally need to drive through our community at least once a week and may drive on our streets several times a day. Stay alert during those times for anything that is suspicious or out of the ordinary. That is particularly true as the daylight hours continue to get shorter and shorter and as the holidays approach. If something looks suspicious to you, **report it!** Make that call to 911. As the saying goes, "If you see something, say something!". Let the police check it out and help keep our community safe and crime free!

Thanksgiving and the holidays are fast approaching and our thoughts turn to holiday activities such as shopping, presents, cooking, family gatherings, etc. With the hustle and bustle at this time of the year, we tend to lose our focus on safety. That is precisely what the "bad guys" hope will happen. Please remember that during the holidays, home burglaries and theft from vehicles tend to increase, so please take a moment to review how you are going to keep yourself and your family safe during this season. Implementing the following **crime prevention tips** is an effective way to start.

- **Lock it up, each time, every time.**

- **Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.**
- **Remove or cut back overgrown shrubs, plants, and trees that obscure windows and doorways.**
- **Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.**
- **Never leave your vehicle running unattended.**
- **Never leave valuables in your vehicles.**
- **Never leave the keys to any property inside your vehicle.**
- **Look outside if you hear noises at night and report anything that looks unusual or suspicious.**
- **Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.**
- **NEVER, EVER, FOR ANY REASON, GIVE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION WHATSOEVER TO ANYONE UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THE SOURCE FIRST**
- **If in doubt, let the police check it out!**
- **If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.**

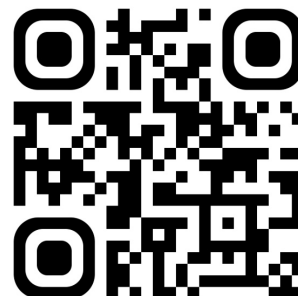
