- Reminder of the two upcoming Kiwanis events being held at the Chartley Shopping Center 1) Saturday, April 22nd will be Free Paper Shredding Day from 8am – 11am and 2) Saturday, May 20th will be the Bike Rodeo shared with Police Franklin District 3 from 10am – 1pm. First 100 registrations get a free Bike Helmet – The BCF Grant was approved so Ernie is all set for the event to go as advertised.
- The Nominating Committee was able to present a Slate of Officers that will appear in the April Chatter.
- Reisterstown Main Street
 - This morning the Business Roundtable Meeting was held at Reter’s Crabhouse & Grille with guest speakers Selisa Jefferson, Baltimore County Department of Economic and Workforce Development and Alexandra Laham – Community Planning Division with Baltimore County Department of Planning
 - National Register Historic Plaque program is underway this year to followup on the work done in 2019 and Ernie who is chairing this project ordered 15 more historic properties with plans to unveil the plaques in ceremonies probably May or June

There will be an All Groups Workshop planned for May 24th General Meeting. &Access expects to complete their Retail Analysis around the same time as NDC.

 - Community Safety Works Grants available to Main Street Businesses and property owners \$500 towards and security purchases

Crime in Chartley-2 crimes, both thefts, were reported in Chartley during March. The first was reported on March 13th in the 200 blk of Glyndon Dr, and the 2nd was reported on March 23rd in the 500 blk of Glen Granite Rd. This brings our YTD total of crimes reported by Chartley residents to 4...all thefts.

- Note: Crime in Chartley article that was put in this month’s Chatter showed only 3 crimes reported YTD instead of 4. That is because the crime on Glen Granite Rd did not appear on the web sites that is used to track crime, until after the article was sent to Jack for publication...No residents on Glen Granite notified Dave that a crime had been committed.
