

Farewell to a Dear Friend of Chartley

Some people walk through life and only leave faint traces that they were here. Others leave giant footprints as a reminder of their journey. Chartley lost such a giant and dear friend as Jack Sloan changed his address from this life to the next on Christmas night.

Jack was a charter member of the Chartley Neighborhood Association (CNA) and has always served as one of our COP Volunteers. He and his wife Betsy were frequently seen walking through the community taking note of anything suspicious or out of the ordinary. Such vigilance contributed greatly to Chartley's crime rate being consistently lower than other communities as criminals take note of such activities and move elsewhere.

Jack was elected as our Treasurer in 2003 and served in that position until 2005. In 2009 he volunteered to become the Editor of the Chartley Chatter when our previous Editor moved out of the Community. From that point on, Jack worked tirelessly to improve the Chatter by streamlining it yet making sure that it kept our residents up to date on happenings of interest within the community. He always insisted that the Chatter should also reflect our status as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization by making sure that income derived from fees paid by advertisers in the Chatter did not exceed the expenses necessary to produce it.

Some years ago, Jack volunteered to take over the task of updating the messages and events displayed on our 3 Community Sign Boards (a.k.a. Directories). On many occasions, this would require him to print the messages at home, trim them to size, then insert them into the Directories, which is another way that residents are kept informed. In addition to these signs, Jack would print signage for every event sponsored by CNA such as National Night Out, Community Clean Up Day, our annual Crab Feast, etc. In all those years, Jack never once asked to be reimbursed a single cent for the hundreds of

printer cartridges he used in printing all those signs, as he was entitled.

Jack was very computer savvy and taught many computer classes at his church. He was always willing to help anyone resolve their computer problems. One of those many that he helped was the author of this remembrance. My nickname for him was "The Wizard." He got me out of more computer trouble than I wish to acknowledge!

Jack served in many other organizations in the Reisterstown area which also helps to define the large footprint he leaves behind. His shoes will be hard to fill. A giant's shoes always are. He will be missed.

Keeping Chartley Beautiful

Happy New Year, everyone. Did anyone make any New Year's resolutions? I suggest we all make the same resolution and that is to clean up our neighborhood, starting with our own yards.

I'm sure you all receive the Sun Plus papers thrown up onto your yard or driveway every week and you're tired of bending over to pick them up. If you don't want this paper, there is a simple way to get rid of it, and that is to call 443-692-9011 or email:

SunPlusService@baltsun.com and ask that your address be removed from their delivery list. I did this years ago. It really works and hopefully these papers won't sit for days in your yard.

Another resolution is to help your neighbors keep their lawns clean of junk. If you know your neighbor is elderly or is otherwise unable to keep their front lawns free of trash, help them out by picking up the trash that blows onto their property. The trash that blows around the neighborhood eventually ends up in the storm drains and can eventually make its way into the waters of the Bay. Your help in keeping your neighborhood clear also helps the environment.

Speaking of the streams and rivers in our areas, on the first Saturday in April people from all regions and neighborhoods gather to clean the streams that run through their properties. In Chartley, we do the same thing by gathering to clean the trash out of the Chartley stream. In years past, we have gotten bags and bags of trash, some of which comes from fences directly behind Chartley homes. So, please, do not dump your trash over the fence into the area by the stream. If the trash is toxic or otherwise against the Code Enforcement rules, you will be cited by Baltimore County.

Another tip for trash-free yards is to always have lids for your garbage cans and recycle bins so your trash doesn't blow up and down the street. In fact, Baltimore County Code Enforcement requires lids on all trash cans.

Did you know that, if you live adjacent to the path that extends from Chartley to Homevale, you are responsible for keeping that path clear and open to walkers? This means you or your lawn care people should trim the bushes if they are overflowing onto the path and keep it shoveled in winter. I'll bet your realtor didn't tell you that! People who walk the neighborhood will really appreciate your effort.

If your house is located at the end of the Chartley Stream, i.e., on Shirley Manor or Sacred Heart Lane, another easy task for the homeowner is to trim the hedges along the sidewalk (if you have any) and cut the grass by the street. Please don't stop cutting the grass where you think your yard ends but continue all the way to the middle of the stream. Make sure to tell your lawn care people to do this as well.

With this little effort, all of us can keep litter from spoiling the beauty of our neighborhood.

Crime In Chartley

Happy New Year Chartley! If the new year is better than last year, as we always hope that it will, our crime rate would then be down close to single digits. Now that would be fantastic! For the entire year of 2023, Chartley residents reported a total of 21 crimes within our community. That is one of the lowest rates we have ever had. We finished 2023 in grand style as well as our residents did not report a single crime for either November or December. The chart below shows the types of crimes and the number of times each crime was reported throughout 2023:

Type of crime	Total 2023
Assault (Non-Domestic)	4
Home Burglary (Breaking and Entering)	2
Theft	13
Destruction of Property (Vandalism)	2
Grand Total for 2023	21

I believe that the continued diligence of our residents to call 911 whenever they see anything suspicious or out of the ordinary has played a major role in our low crime numbers in 2023. I'm fully aware that some of the residual effects of the pandemic also helped in this regard. For example, there are still a lot of employees who are continuing to work from home instead of returning to brick-and-mortar offices. Historically, most home burglaries take place on weekdays during the hours of 10 AM and 2 PM. With large numbers of people still working from home, the opportunity for this type of crime was dramatically reduced. Nevertheless, I still see quite a few police calls from residents for "suspicious vehicle," "suspicious person", "check on location," "noise disturbance," etc. This tells me that our residents are more alert than ever and are following our adage of "if in doubt, let the police check it out". WAY TO GO CHARTLEY!!!

At the last Police Community Relations Council meeting in November, Captain Jamerson, Commanding Officer of Precinct 3, stated that theft of vehicles was continuing to increase throughout the nation, particularly Hyundai and Kia vehicles. Owners of these types of vehicles are urged to acquire the factory-suggested recall (fix) as soon as possible. Captain Jamerson also stated that shoplifting, commercial burglaries, and robberies were also increasing. Part of this may be due to the usual increase in these types of crimes during the Holiday season. Nevertheless, we urge Chartley residents to continue their vigilance outside of the Chartley community by always calling 911 when they see anything suspicious or out of the ordinary wherever they may be. Preventing/stopping any crime helps everyone regardless of the community in which we live.

As indicated above, the number of crimes reported by Chartley residents during 2023 was very low, and we certainly hope to do even better this year. We have found that the Crime Prevention Tips we include at the end of each of our Crime in Chartley articles are very effective when put into practice. So please review these tips (below) again and adopt them as your own TODAY!

- Lock it up, each time, every time.
- Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.
- Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.
- Never leave your vehicle running unattended.
- Never leave valuables in your vehicles.
- Never leave the keys to any property inside your vehicle.
- Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.
- NEVER, EVER, FOR ANY REASON, GIVE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION WHATSOEVER TO ANYONE UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THE SOURCE FIRST
- If in doubt, let the police check it out!

Happy New Year everyone! I hope we all celebrated in whichever way was most enjoyable (and safe) to each of us! This is the setting for this review, where six of us spent New Years' Eve, and it was a marvelous, and rather unique setting! As a kind of "back story", a couple weeks earlier, one in our cozy little dinner group, suggested the Peppermill restaurant for our New Year's Eve bash! Having never been there, and usually up for a new experience, we agreed! In the days approaching "party night", we were advised by a few people that this was a restaurant for, shall we say, people of a more mature and grown-up persuasion. In short... older people! Fast forward to our walking in, and voila, they were right! It did feel like I was in one of the dining rooms at the Charlestown retirement community (which I was about a month before). There are apparently a few reasons for that which I won't get into, but skipping ahead, we were all very happy with our meals, and the service from our very nice server named Connie. I ordered the pasta with crab meat, and it was indeed delicious. The cost was \$22.95. Several in our group got a fish dish; one friend ordered Filet Mignon which she said was just perfect, and she could cut it with a butter knife! (this was \$24.95) The entrees come with rolls and one side, and everyone was equally as happy with the sides too (the rolls were warm and luscious!). We spoke to a few folks at nearby tables, and they were all just as friendly as can be (but what else would you expect from us seniors!) My friend and I thought the portion sizes were "moderate", probably with their

senior circuit clientele in mind, but it honestly was more than sufficient, no complaints! (And of course, to be clear, ALL are welcome!) Interestingly, my filet mignon friend took her aunt there a few nights later! Their full menu and prices are listed on their website. Visit Peppermill Restaurant at 1301 York Rd Lutherville, Md. 21093 just north of the beltway, only about 20 minutes from the Chartley area, I very much doubt you'll be sorry. Happy Eating!
