Planning is underway for Spring and Summer Events on Main Street ... come with family and friends to enjoy. Help is always welcome.



through August 29th from 6:30 pm – 9:30 pm (skipping July 4th). Mark your calendars! A list of bands will be published in one of our future newsletters.





CLEAN the Chartley Stream!

On Saturday, April 5th volunteers from the Chartley community and their friends will clean our stream that flows through Chartley from Shirley Manor Road to Gwynnwest Road. Volunteers will gather on Sacred Heart Lane, between Chartley Drive and Highmeadow Road, at 9 am to remove debris and trash from the stream and its banks.



This annual event, sponsored by The Alliance for the Chesapeake, has expanded to include volunteers from Maryland, Pennsylvania, Delaware, and Virginia. Last year there were fifty-four Clean Stream events in the Chesapeake Bay region, in which 1032 volunteers removed 28,008 pounds of trash.

The goal of the Clean Stream activity is to clean up and promote the health and restoration of our local waterways. It is an opportunity for our residents to take hands-on action and engage in environmental stewardship. It helps us visualize the trash and debris in our streets washing down into storm drains and flowing into the Jones Falls Waterway and finally into the Chesapeke Bay.

It is easy to volunteer. Everyone is invited. No experience is required. Dress appropriately for the weather and wear hard soled shoes/boots, long pants and long sleeve shirt/jacket. Come out and enjoy the spring weather with your neighbors and friends. We meet at Sacred Heart Lane at 9 am on Saturday, April 5th. Gloves and bags will be provided. Students may earn service credits.

Crime In Chartley

No crimes were reported in Chartley during February, leaving our year-to-date total at 2. Two incidents were initially reported as happening in our community, but after further investigation occurred outside of Chartley (i.e. not on any Chartley streets or properties of the 790 homes in our community). First, an armed robbery on February 6th was incorrectly recorded as occurring in the 700 block of Shirley Manor Road when it happened in the Chartley Shopping Center. It involved several juveniles and is being reviewed by the police and appropriate juvenile authorities. Second, a burglary in another police precinct that involved a police pursuit of a stolen vehicle fleeing from the scene of the burglary incident, was incorrectly reported to have occurred on February 19th. The incident involved multiple police vehicles with all emergency equipment activated (i.e., flashing lights and sirens), and with a helicopter flying over our community for some time. The pursuit led police onto several Chartley community streets before the chase was finally terminated in Chartley and several arrests were made. The incident quickly appeared on social media with concerned residents wondering what was going on, with some expressing negative feelings about "the high crime rate" in Chartley. However, Chartley has had the distinction of having the lowest crime rate of any of our surrounding communities for several years! That is why the CNA has a dynamic Citizens on Patrol organization that actively patrols our streets, tracks crime throughout the entire area, works with both our residents and the police to help maintain Chartley as a clean, safe, and pleasant place to live. For those who choose to condemn Chartley for its so-called

high crime rate, we would like to invite you to be a part of the solution instead of part of the problem by helping us to reduce our crime rate even further – be alert whenever you are out, and report anything suspicious or out of the ordinary by calling 911.

The always popular Citizens Police Academy has been renamed The Community Partnership Academy. This program gives citizens an opportunity to become informed and educated about the many aspects of police work and the fostering of relationships. The deadline to apply for the next session is March 24th. The Academy will begin on April 2 and will end on May 21st. The Academy is a nine-class program. The classes are in the evening from 6:30 to 9:30 pm. and there is one Saturday class from 9 am to 3 pm. As spring approaches, door-to-door salespeople will once again start knocking on our door trying to sell everything from roof or window replacements to a bridge over Main Street! Some of these solicitors represent legitimate businesses, but others do not. How can you keep these salespeople from knocking on vour door? The County Code specifies that solicitors are prohibited from offering "any service or item of merchandise for sale to the occupant of a residential property in the county if the owner or occupant has visibly displayed on the property a "No Soliciting" sign, or a sign containing similar words." The Code provides for a fine not to exceed \$100 for each offense. If you are concerned about door-to-door salespeople, you can report them by calling 311. You can find complete information regarding this on our CNA website (https://www.chartleyneighborhood.org). The information there is a copy of all the salient points contained in the County Code about this issue. May we suggest that you print the code out and post it in some convenient place (e.g., refrigerator), for easy access.

With the approach of spring, warmer weather, and the change back to Daylight Savings Time, we will have the opportunity to spend more time outdoors. As we do so, we tend to forget to do simple things such as keeping the doors to our homes locked while we are outside. Last year there were several reports of thieves going into an UNLOCKED home while the owners were outside working in their yard. So, take a moment to review the Crime Prevention Tips below and make them a part of your everyday routines. Don't let the bad guys win.

- Lock it up, each time, every time.
- Keep the outside of your house illuminated after dark.
- Remove or cut back overgrown shrubs, plants, and trees that obscure windows and doorways.
- Strongly consider the installation of home security cameras around your property.
- Never leave your vehicle running unattended.
- Never leave valuables in your vehicles.
- Never leave the keys to any property inside your vehicle.
- Look outside if you hear noises at night and report anything that looks unusual or suspicious.
- Be aware of your surroundings wherever you are, particularly when you are outside or shopping after dark.
- NEVER, EVER, FOR ANY REASON, GIVE ANY PERSONAL INFORMATION WHATSOEVER TO ANYONE UNTIL YOU HAVE VERIFIED THE SOURCE FIRST
- If in doubt, let the police check it out!
- If you see something, say something! Call 911 each time, every time.
- Remember that if you do not call 911, there will not be a police response... no response...no police follow up to prevent further crimes...MAKE THAT CALL, EACH TIME, EVERY TIME. And call 911 even if you do make a mistake and the criminals take advantage of you. Never be too embarrassed to make that call. You could be helping someone else by allowing the police to start closing the ring on the criminals. MAKE THAT CALL!



This designation permits students, families, educators, and community members to develop a grassroots vision for their school and communities, and to work together to achieve their vision. 




EARTH DAY CLEAN-UP
