Police Issues & Police Community Relations - - Dave Powers

Crime in Chartley-2 crimes were reported in Chartley during April...both on the same day and in the 200 block of Walgrove Rd (no indication that these are related). The first was a theft on April 23rd and the 2nd was a home burglary. This brings our YTD total to 6 crimes reported (5 thefts and one burglary). As a FYI, a number of crimes/disturbances were reported from the Chartleytowne Apts located on the west side of Gwynwest. Chartley residents continue to be alert and are reporting such things as suspicious person, suspicious vehicles, check on location, etc. This continues to indicate that our residents are being more observant than previously.

PCRC Meeting-March 15, 2023

Capt. Jamerson's Report

- New Police Chief was announced today as Chief Robert McCullough. He is a 35-year veteran of the Police Department. Capt Jamerson said he had worked with him in the past and that he is a well qualified person for the job and that since his appointment was announced morals had improved.
- New Assistant Precinct Commander...Lt Matt Jackson
- Hundai and Kia vehicles are still being stolen throughout the nation and Baltimore
 County. Owners are urged to contact their dealership to get a software update that will
 help prevent these thefts. Police are reporting a reluctance of owners of these vehicles to
 get the software update.
- Police are seeing an increase in the theft of lawn equipment. Always remember to keep such equipment properly secured and to keep your shed locked.
- Theft from unlocked vehicles is still a major concern throughout the County.
- Automobile thefts are increasing in the Precinct (other than Hundai and Kia vehicles)
- An instance was reported where the police arrested the same kid 4 times within a week for automobile theft...had to release him due to prevailing law.

Guest Speaker-Ms. Heather Sheridan, Chief of Homeless Services, of the Department of Housing and Community Development (New Department)

As of 3/15/23 there were approximately 700-900 homeless people in Baltimore County, both in shelters and on the street

Currently have 600 bunk beds in County shelters

When approved (e.g. special circumstances) a homeless person can stay in a County shelter for up to 6 months

Provide a Homeless Outreach program where they work one on one with homeless people to provide needed services.

Do not provide services directly to individuals, only to service providers.

Can provide services to help people stay in their homes instead of becoming homeless...e.g. replace roof, provide food, etc.

Also provides a Rapid Rehousing program which is a short-term rental to help people in extreme situations

Was told both were at their desks, but when the clerk told them what the call was about, they had suddenly 'stepped out', left them a message. Ernie informed me that these two had failed to return his calls and emails for the past several years.
