- Zoning Hearing coming soon:
 - 2/27 @1:30pm 3:30pm Webex meeting Zoning Hearing 515 Owings Avenue, 534, 536 Reisterstown Road (actually Main Street) Special Hearing (534) to extinguish previously approved Special Exception in Case 66-98-X. To allow existing building to straddle existing property lines where the subject properties have not merged. Variance to permit a side yard setback for adjacent commercial building of 0 feet in lieu of 30 feet. For a rear yard setback for accessory structures of 0 feet in lieu of 30 feet. To permit 0% of the parking lot area for interior landscaping in lieu of the otherwise required 7%. Special Exception to permit a used motor vehicle outdoor sales area separated from a sales agency building. Variance (356) to permit a side yard setback of 0 feet in lieu of 30 feet. For a rear yard setback for accessory structures of 0 feet in lieu of 30 feet.

- Business Roundtable held this morning at Reter's Crab House with guest speaker Steve Lafferty who is head of the Department of Planning since 2021. He outlined the various aspects of the department and spoke of working with Reisterstown and our goals. March Speaker will be Kirk Mitchell, District 4 Community Engagement Coordinator
- continued work with NDC and &Access with more focus groups after the first two (January Business Roundtable & FHS students) – still plans for Senior Center w/legacy community members, non-profit & then a workshop most likely at the May General Meeting so will continue involving the community every step of the way.
- continue to award our \$500 Safety Grants to property owners (7 so far are completed) and businesses on Main Street
- continue planning for other grants we have been awarded expenditures keep an eye on improvements for Main Street in 2023
- continue celebrating businesses with a Grand Re-Opening for Spik-a-rizum, 215 Main Street was held Friday the 10th @ noon. There are many artists who are displaying and selling their work (I believe on a consignment basis) They will have workshops Wednesday and Thursday by appointment and be open to the public Friday through Sunday.
- Planning continues for 2023 events meetings held in the Welcome Center @ 202 Main Street and everyone can use volunteer help on their committee.
